Actually, several of these are already included as measures in the **2010 PQRI (Physician Quality Reporting Initiative) list**.

"These items were chosen by the National Commission on Prevention Priorities, and highlight those preventive services including immunizations, screenings, preventive medications, and counseling that give "the most bang for the buck." □

1. Discuss Daily Aspirin Use
2. Childhood Immunization
3. Smoking Cessation Advice and Help to Quit
4. Screening for Alcohol Misuse and Brief Counseling
5. Colorectal Cancer Screening
6. Hypertension Screening
7. Influenza Immunization
8. Vision Screening
9. Cervical Cancer Screening
10. Cholesterol Screening
